

OKC Gun Club Archery Division Rules

The OKC Gun Club Archery Division will maintain its own rules, age divisions, classes and stake placement guided by, but not necessarily exactly as current ASA rules. We understand that all situations can not be covered by rules and do not wish to do so. Competitors who compete with a sense of fairness and who do not try to take advantage of or try to bend the rules as far as possible should have no issues while competing at the Gun Club. The OKCGC Archery Division will generally, but not necessarily use ASA Pro-Am rules to resolve issues not covered by club rules. In all cases the ruling of Gun Club officials is final. Club Officials will decide all disputes and resolve any rules discrepancies or ambiguity in the perceived best interest of all competitors who participate in our events.

I. Hours

- A. Saturday 8am to 3pm
- B. Sunday 8am to 3pm
- C. Trophy rounds must be complete by 6pm on Sunday

II. Fees

- A. First round
 - 1. \$30 Money Class
 - 2. \$15 Non members
 - 3. \$10 Members
 - 4. \$5 Youth (13-17)
 - 5. Free - Cubs
- B. Second Round
 - 1. \$10 Non member
 - 2. \$8 Members
 - 3. \$5 Youth (13-17)
 - 4. Same as first if shooting Known class for trophy
- C. Military @ member rate

III. Classes

- Shooters must shoot in at least the class shot at national or regional level
- All pros and semi-pros must shoot in Money class
- Bow Novice shooters who score above 200 or in the top 3 in 3 tournaments must move up to the Hunter or Open classes to compete for trophies.
- Club Officials reserve the right to move shooters to a higher class based on knowledge of/or the shooters experience.
- Where not specified, see Section IV below for arrow speed limits based on Age divisions and class.
- Club Officials will make any equipment classification decisions with a bias towards placing the equipment in a higher class if questionable.

A. Money

- 1. 280 Max Speed
- 2. Payback Schedule
 - a) Payback in the Money Class will be 2/3 of the \$30 entry fee (\$20).
 - b) 1 place will be paid for less than 5 shooters.
 - c) 2 Places will be paid 70/30 for 5 to 9 shooters.
 - d) 3 Places will be paid 60 /30/10 for 10 or more shooters.
- 3. All Pros/Semi-Pros must compete in this class or shoot a fun round.
- 4. Amateurs may compete in the Money class.
- 5. Must be 18
- 6. Pink Stake (50yd max)

B. Crossbow

- 1. No Props
- 2. No Stabilizers
- 3. Standing Position
- 4. No Age or Sex Divisions
- 5. Pink Stake (50 yd max)

C. Known

1. Shooters may shoot the Known class for a trophy after a first round for trophy in an unknown class.
2. Shooters may not shoot an unknown class for trophy after shooting a known class.
3. Shooters may shoot a traditional round for trophy after shooting a known class round.
4. Adult (Men&Women) White Stake (45 yd max) 280 Fps

D. Open

1. Sr White Stake (45 yd max)
2. Adult White Stake (45 yd max)
3. SSr Red Stake (40 yd max)
4. Sr Women's Red Stake (40 yd max)
5. Women's Red Stake (40 yd max)
6. Young Adult Red Stake (40 yd max)
7. Youth Blue Stake (30 yd max)
8. Sr. Eagles Yellow Stake (25 yd max)
9. Eagles Green Stake (20 yd max)
10. Jr Eagles Orange Stake (15 yd max)

E. ASA Hunter

H. Traditional

Shooters may shoot the Traditional class for a trophy after a first round for trophy in an unknown class and/or a second round for a trophy in the known class. Shooters may not shoot an unknown class for trophy after shooting a known or traditional class.

2. Sr Wood Stake (30 yd max)
3. Adult Wood Stake (30 yd max)
4. Women's Sr Yellow Stake (25 yd max)

I. My Class

1. Choose any class/division from any organization or make up your own.
2. Not eligible for trophies.

IV. Divisions (Age)

Senior Class age requirements are based on the age of the competitor as of December 31st of the current year. All Youth classes (through age 18) are based on the competitors age as of March 1st. Anyone in Young Adult must still be in high school, or have graduated during the current season.

- A. 60+ Super Senior (SSr) - Optional. 280 fps Max except GC Hunter
- B. 50+ Senior (Sr)- Optional. 280 fps Max except GC Hunter
- C. 18* Adult 280 fps Max except GC Hunter
- D. 15-17 Young Adult 280 fps Max in Open/ASA Hunter
- E. 13-14 Youth 240 fps Max in Open/ASA Hunter
- F. 11-12 Senior Eagles 230 fps Max in Open/ASA Hunter
- G. 9-10 Eagles 230 fps Max in Open/ASA Hunter
- H. 6-8 Jr Eagles 220 fps Max in Open/ASA Hunter
- I. <6 Cubs Bow can be safely drawn.

V. Division (Sex)

The Women's divisions are optional. Female competitors may choose to compete in the adult, young adult class or the appropriate Women's subdivision.

VI. Stakes

Maximum yardages are approximate to allow for range finder error/variation. Targets WILL NOT be intentionally set beyond maximum yardages.

- A. Pink 50 yd Max
- B. White 45 yd Max
- C. Red 40 yd Max
- D. Blue 30 yd Max

- E. Wood 30 yd Max
- F. Yellow 25 yd Max
- G. Green 20 yd Max
- H. Orange 15 yd Max

VII. Scoring

- A. ASA rules with the following exceptions:
 - 1. Lower 12s only for club events.
 - 2. The 14 ring will NOT be scored as 14, it will be scored as an 8.
 - 3. Trophy rounds will be scored on a colored score card
 - 4. Fun rounds will be scored on a white or tan card
 - 5. Traditional Classes will not count the 14 or 12 rings.
- B. Modern Class Scoring will therefore be 12 (lower ring), 10, 8, 5, 0.
- C. Traditional Class will not score the 12 ring, therefore Traditional Class scoring will be 10, 8, 5, 0.
- D. Arrow MUST touch line! "Pulling the line" counts as lower score.
- E. See Expanded rules ER II and ER III below for full scoring rules.

VIII. Arrow Speed

- A. No limit in Gun Club Hunter Class
- B. ASA limits in other classes
 - 1. 280 Fps in Adult classes
 - 2. 260 Fps in Women's Hunter
 - 3. 240 Fps in Youth (13/14)
 - 4. 230 Fps in Sr Eagle (11/12)
 - 5. 230 Fps in Eagle (9/10)
 - 6. 220 Fps in Jr Eagle (7/8)

IX. Trophies

Trophies will be awarded in all listed classes based on minimum participation as described below. All Shooters twelve and under will receive a participation ribbon/medal.

- A. Minimum of 5 shooters in Adult Class
 - 1. 5 shooters for 1st place trophy
 - 2. 6 shooters for 1st & 2nd place trophies
 - 3. 10 shooters for 1st - 3rd place trophies
- B. Minimum of 3 shooters in young adult
- C. No min 12 & under – Medals for 2nd and 3rd
- D. Youth Classes may be combined

X. Decisions

- A. All decisions made by club officials are final.
- B. An official protest must be filed with a \$50 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.

- C. Any continued dispute either in person or on the internet will result in Dis-Qualification and a one year ban from Gun Club archery events.
- D. Dispute by non-involved parties will result in DQ and possible Ban.
- E. See expanded rules ER VIII and ER IX for more information.

XI. Liability/Photo release

- A. Persons participating in Gun Club Archery Division events assume responsibility for their own actions and all consequences of an outdoor event with inherent risks.
- B. Photos may be taken of tournament participants to be used in promotional materials and for the web photo album. Photos will be removed from electronic media upon participant's written or electronic request.
- C. See expanded rules ER VII for full liability information.

XII. Rangefinders

- A. Only allowed when/as permitted by sanctioning org
- B. Only permitted in Known classes
- C. Using parts of the body to gauge distance is not permitted.
- D. Discussion of range with unknown class shooters will result in DQ and possible ban from OKCGC archery events.
- E. See expanded rules ER I below for full Rangefinding rules.

XIII. Binoculars

- A. Must be handheld
- B. No rangefinding marks/capability

XIV. Arrows

- A. Speed
 - 1. IAW Sanctioning Body.
 - 2. For club shoots ASA limits apply except to the Gun Club Hunter Class
 - 3. No Speed limit in Gun Club Hunter Class
- B. Weight
 - 1. 5 grains pp draw weight unless waived by bow mfg

XV. Range Preview

- A. No shooter may preview the range prior to a modern (except known 45) round.
- B. No competitor may practice or shoot a fun round on a tournament range prior to their official round.

XVI. Littering

- A. Littering will not be tolerated
- B. Anyone littering on tournament grounds will be subject to disqualification
- C. Trash bins are provided on the course. Please feel free to pick up and

properly dispose of any litter found on the ranges, even if it is not yours.

XVII. Spectators and Guests.

- A. Spectators are not allowed on the tournament ranges until the range official begins the competition.
- B. Providing information or coaching to a shooter during a trophy round is strictly prohibited.
- C. Spectators and guests are to avoid conversation while others are shooting as a courtesy. All cell phones and pagers are to be turned off to avoid disturbing the competitors.
- D. Photography shall not interfere with the shooters or the flow of the competition.
- E. Spectators may not have range finders in their possession unless that range or competition area has been designated for known distance competition. Anyone with range finders will be required to surrender them or leave the range.
- F. Spectators may assist by carrying items such as stools, umbrellas, ice chests, food, drinks, or other items for the convenience of shooters, but must stay outside the shooting ropes at all times

XVIII. Severe Weather

- A. – OKC Gun Club Archery Division retains the right to delay or cancel a tournament day in case of severe weather. Should a round be suspended, all shooters are to leave the range once the group has completed shooting and scoring the target unless an imminent threat exists, in which case, all shot arrows are to be left in the target and are not to be scored or pulled.
- B. Shooters will be notified by a range official how to proceed.
- C. All scorekeepers shall retain the score cards in their possession and no shooter is to have possession of their own official card.
- D. The Tournament Director will have two hours to exercise one of the following options based upon the weather and the availability of ranges:
 - 1. Resume shooting that day within two hours of that day's suspension and subject to being able to complete the round that day,
 - 2. Complete the round the next day, or
 - 3. Cancel the round completely if weather precludes shooting on Sunday.
 - 4. Should a round be cancelled, the competitors score will be the total of the targets completed; no refunds will be made; and all results and paybacks will be based on the targets completed by the competitors.

XIX. Alcoholic Beverages.

- A. Use of Alcoholic Beverages on Tournament Grounds is discouraged, but allowed under OKC Gun Club Bylaws with restrictions.
- B. No alcohol may be carried on the tournament ranges.
- C. No shooter will compete while under the influence of alcohol or any

other controlled substance(s) under penalty of disqualification.

D. No shooter may handle any weapons on tournament grounds after drinking an alcoholic beverage.

E. Any person asked to discontinue use of alcoholic beverages by a tournament official must do so immediately or leave the tournament grounds.



Expanded Rules

ER I Range Finding

- A. Range finding is prohibited except in the Known Class.
- B. All distances will be judged by the naked eye.
- C. No equipment, including but not limited to sights, binoculars, or spotting scopes will be used in a manner inconsistent with this prohibition.
- D. Using any part of the shooter's body is prohibited, which includes "gapping techniques" that may also use equipment, or the "stepping off" of the distance to, or from, any target.
- E. Shooters may carry "target cards" reflecting a picture or rendering of the specific targets being shot, but no marks or notations of any type may be made on these cards.
- F. In addition, the prohibition on marks or notations includes carrying, or making, any additional notes about yardages or features of any target on a competition range.
- G. Penalty: Any offense upheld by the Competition Committee will result in disqualification of the shooter from the event, (with no refund of entry fees paid) and a possible suspension for the remainder of the season/next season.
- H. The shooter will be required to submit a request for reinstatement that must be reviewed and approved by the Competition Committee before the shooter will be permitted to compete in an OKC Gun Club sanctioned event.

ER II Scorecards

- A. Scorecards will be available at the sign in table. Shooters will pick up the official colored scorecard along with one white/tan "shooter's copy" scorecard (if used) which is to be retained by the shooter for their record.
- B. The properly completed official colored scorecard must be turned in by the group within fifteen minutes of completion of competition, and prior to leaving the range to receive credit for that day's competition.
- C. All information on the scorecard must be accurate with all information completely and properly filled in. Information blocks left blank, incomplete, or reflecting incorrect information will result in a deduction of ten points from the score.
- D. Any Scoring inconsistencies will be corrected to the lower score amount. Ie If the running total reflects a 12 point increase, but the

target block reflects a zero, the target will be scored as ZERO.

E. If the number of 12 rings is left blank it will be scored as zero.

F. No changes may be made to the official score card after the scorekeeper and shooter have signed the scorecard. If a shooter changes his scorecard after it has been signed by the scorekeeper, the shooter will receive a score of zero.

G. Each group will designate two members of their group as "Scorers" and two as "Scorekeepers." If a group has only three shooters, one will act as Scorer with the two Scorekeepers alternating as the second Scorer.

H. Scorers will judge and score each arrow and call out the results to be recorded on the respective shooter's scorecards by the Scorekeepers.

I. Scorekeepers will maintain one scorecard for each shooter and be responsible for recording each arrow. A scorekeeper may not keep his or her own colored "official" card. Scorekeepers will record the total score and total number of 12 Rings at the end of the round.

J. The completed official colored scorecard must be reviewed and signed as correct by the Scorekeeper and the shooter. Any shooter serving as a scorekeeper must turn in the scored and signed "official" scorecard of the other scorekeeper. Any shooter turning in an "official" card on which they are both the shooter and scorekeeper will receive a score of zero.

K. The Scorekeepers for each shooting group must turn in the official scorecards for the group together except when a shooter is permitted to make-up targets due to an equipment failure or other approved leave. Shooters assume full responsibility for the accuracy of the information and scores on their cards. Any group that does not turn in their scorecards together before leaving the range will receive a score of zero.

ER III Arrow Scoring.

A. All arrows must remain in the target until all arrows are scored. The arrow shaft must be touching a portion of the next highest scoring line to be scored for the higher value. All scoring shall be done with the naked eye without the aid of any special magnification with the exception of prescription glasses or contacts. The status of any doubtful arrows must be determined before drawing any arrow from the target. The score is based on the status of the arrow while all other arrows remain in the target. Arrows may not be removed until a scoring judgment has been made and no changes may be made to the score after removal of any arrow. Targets may not be moved or dislodged for scoring purposes, and shall be returned to their proper upright position upon removal of the arrows. If both Scorers are in agreement, the score

will stand. Should the Scorers be unable to reach an agreement, the Scorekeepers will alternate the responsibility of making the final determination before any arrows are removed. Groups will be responsible for calling their own arrows. Club Officials can make arrow calls when a group is unable to reach a decision (or the arrow will be scored the lower of the disputed values), or during special competitions and shoot-offs.

B. Target “Pass Through” or “Rebound” without striking another arrow:

C. Arrows passing through the front of, but still in, the target will be pushed back and scored

1. If the group agrees and confirms that an arrow passed through at the target’s “Insert Seam” the shooter will be given a score based on the point of pass through not to exceed eight points,
2. If the group agrees and confirms that the arrow actually passed through the target due to the high number of arrows that had been shot at the target, the range official is to be notified and the shooter will be allowed to take the score where the “pass-through” occurred as determined by the group up to a maximum score of 10 points, or
3. If the group agrees and confirms that the arrow “rebounded” off the target without striking another arrow the shooter will be allowed to take the score where the “rebound” occurred as determined by the group up to a maximum score of 10 points. Special Note: A score of 12 will not be permitted under these rules.
4. Any arrow embedded (“Robin Hood”) in the nock of another arrow will be scored the same as the arrow it is embedded in.
5. Any arrow rebounded off an Arrow (a “Robin Hood” that strikes and damages another arrow and does not proceed toward the target, but bounces back) will be scored the same as the arrow it struck, provided the damaged arrow can be identified.
6. Any arrow deflected by contact with another arrow already in the target and still proceeding toward the target will be scored as the greater of:
 - a) *where it lies in the target; or*
 - b) *a maximum of five (5) points if it is not in the target.*

D. Arrows in the corresponding area of the target will be scored with point values of 5, 8, 10, 12 as shown in the diagram at the sign in table. Each target will have two (2) 12-rings, but only the lower twelve ring will be scored. Knowing the correct 12-ring for the competition is the responsibility of the shooter prior to beginning the round.

E. I. The point of the arrow must be imbedded in the target to be scored except as provided for above, or the arrow will be scored as a zero.

ER IV Traditional Range/Classes General Rules

A. This style of shooting is for those who wish to compete with the Recurve or Longbow.

- 1. No device of any kind, including arrow rest, that can be used for sighting will be used or attached to the archer's equipment.**
- 2. There shall be no device, mechanical or otherwise, in the sight window except the arrow rest, arrow plate or plunger button.**
- 3. No part of the rest or arrow plate may extend more than 1/4 inch above the arrow.**
- 4. No clickers, drawchecks or levels will be allowed. No laminations, marks or blemishes on the face of the bow or in the sight window will be legal.**
- 5. The string may be of any color but must have a single color center serving. One single nocking point is permitted. One or two nock locators may be used. Brush buttons and string silencers, properly placed, may be used. Any other marks or string attachments will be illegal.**
- 6. One anchor point only is permitted.**
- 7. The archer shall touch the arrow when nocked and drawing the arrow with the index finger against the nock. Finger position may not be changed during competition. In the case of physical disability of the arms or hands, a chew strap may be used in place of fingers.**
- 8. Gloves, tabs or fingers shall be the only legal releases. In the case of physical disability of the arms or hands, a chew strap may be used in place of fingers.**
- 9. All arrows shall be identical in length, weight, diameter and fletching with allowances for wear and tear.**
- 10. No stabilizer or counter balance may be used.**

B. The Traditional range will consist of twenty targets for the Recurve, Longbow and Selfbow classes.

C. Participants may shoot in each of the three classes on the Traditional range.

ER V Traditional Classes

THESE CLASSES WILL ONLY BE USED IF A TRADITIONAL ONLY RANGE IS SET.

- A. Traditional Recurve - 30 yd Max -No arrow material restrictions**
- B. Traditional Longbow - 25 yd Max -No arrow material restrictions**
- C. Traditional Selfbow - 20 yd Max - No arrow material restrictions**
- D. Youth Stake - 15 yd Max**

ER VI Shooting Time Allowed

A. Pace

1. Each group will be responsible for monitoring and adhering to the following pace of shooting:
2. Upon commencement of the round by a verbal announcement of the range official the first shooter at each target will be allowed two minutes to shoot their arrow.
3. Each remaining member of the group will be allocated one minute to shoot.
4. Each group will be permitted four minutes to score the target, pull arrows and reach the next stake at which point the time allotment procedure repeats.
5. Any shooter who fails to adhere to their specified time limit will receive a warning from the group or range official for the first offense. The penalty for all subsequent offenses is a deduction of five points from target score, and each subsequent offense will receive a score of zero.

B. Leaving the range

1. The following are the only conditions under which a shooter may leave the range and return to receive credit for the day's competition. The shooter will be allocated additional time to complete any targets missed in the presence of two scorers designated by the range official, or by the range official, who will be responsible for scoring and completing the shooter's score card.
2. Equipment failure need not be visible, but must be reported to a tournament official. If the equipment failure occurs during the act of shooting, the arrow will be scored as shot. The shooter will have up to forty-five (45) minutes from the time the shooter is picked up for equipment replacement or repair. Each shooter is limited to one (1) repair or replacement of equipment per tournament. A shooter with a second breakdown will be allowed to repair or replace their equipment, but will not be allowed to make up missed targets and each target missed will be scored as zero.
3. Any shooter leaving the range for a personal time-out must first check-in with the range official, and must then check back with the official within five minutes and complete the round.
4. After the allotted time the range official will call time and shooters may complete the target being shot. Further shooting will cease and scores will be totaled on targets completed and a zero recorded for each incomplete target.

ER VII ACKNOWLEDGMENTS, RELEASES, AND WAIVERS:

- A. As a participant in an OKC Gun Club Event, all shooters and spectators (hereinafter referred to as Releasor) acknowledge they are VOLUNTARILY participating or attending.
- B. Releasor should be aware that an archery tournament creates the risk of serious personal injury or death.
- C. By participating, they realize they may experience loss or damage to personal property. Releasors assume all risk of injury, death, and loss of personal property that may result from their participation in these

archery tournaments.

D. By registering to participate and thereby agreeing to abide by the rules herein, Releasor releases and discharges the Oklahoma City Gun Club, tournament sponsors, host organizations, property owners, and the tournament staff and volunteers (herein collectively referred to as "Releasees") from liabilities or injuries, damages, or other loss sustained by the shooter as a result of negligence or strict liability of the released parties.

E. **Liability Release:** Releasor, being of lawful age, (or, in the case of a minor, through his/her parent or guardian) in consideration of being permitted to participate in various shooting disciplines and activities, either as a member or guest, do for themselves, their spouse, legal representatives, heirs, assigns and subrogors, hereby release, waive and forever discharge Releasees from any and all liability for any and all losses and damages of any type or kind, and from any and all claims, suits, demands, actions or rights of actions, of whatever kind, either in law or equity, arising from or by reason of death, personal injury known or unknown, or property damage resulting from any incident which may occur during Releasor's presence at the Facility, and/or participation in any activity, whether caused in whole or in part by the Releasees or any other person or thing at the host while Releasor is present. Releasor, and his/her parent or guardian in the event Releasor is a minor, agree to fully indemnify, defend and hold Releasees harmless for all Releasor's actions or omissions while at the host. There is no limit to this indemnity. Releasor assumes full responsibility for the risk of bodily injury, death or property damage due to the negligence of the Releasees or any other third party or thing while at the Releasees Facility, and while competing, officiating, working, spectating, or for any purpose at the Releasees Facility. Releasor fully and completely releases the Releasees and any of its related parties or and from all liability to Releasor and to anyone or any entity claiming by, through or under Releasor, by subrogation or otherwise, it being Releasor's intent to fully waive and release all subrogation rights. Releasor agrees that this Release Agreement is intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by law and that if any portion hereof is held invalid, the balance hereof will continue in full force and effect. Releasor agrees that this release constitutes the entire agreement between Releasor and Releasees and the terms of this release are contractual and not a mere recital, and the same shall continue in full force and be applicable to any and all activities Releasor attends while at the Releasees facility. Releasor has carefully read this release and understands all of its terms. Releasor accepts the same voluntarily and with full knowledge of its

content and significance as a condition of competing or participating.

F. **Participant Agreement:** Oklahoma City Gun Club events are sanctioned sporting events governed by rules. The Tournament Director and Competition Committee shall settle all disputes, and all decisions will be final and without legal appeal. Oklahoma City Gun Club reserves the right to restrict or deny entry into any event by any individual, and / or to designate their competitive class.

G. **Photo Release:** By registering to participate in an Oklahoma City Gun Club Tournament, shooters acknowledge and agree that photographs or videotape of them may be taken while participating in Oklahoma City Gun Club Tournaments and/or tournament related activities. Shooters further agree that photographs and videotape may be used by the Tournament Director, Sponsors, or the Press without royalties or prior consent to help promote Oklahoma City Gun Club and the sport of archery. This is not a release for specific product endorsements without the shooter's prior consent.

ER VIII COMPETITION COMMITTEE:

A. The Competition Committee will consist of one at large tournament shooter and an alternate in addition to the Range Master and Officers of the Oklahoma City Gun Club Archery Division. The at large members will be determined by a random drawing from shooters present or with concurrence of the party filing the grievance and the OKC Gun Club Officers. In the event parties can not agree on composition, membership will be determined by OKC Gun Club Officers.

B. Competition Committee will review all grievances and protests, as well as interpret the rules. All protests filed that could affect the results of the competition must be resolved prior to the next round of competition, or prior to the announcement of final results. All shooters agree to be bound by the decisions of the Competition Committee as final.

C. Any grievance or protest must be filed in writing with the Competition Committee within one (1) hour of completion of a round or prior to the final shoot down, along with a \$50.00 protest fee. If the Committee rules in favor of the protest, or the protest/grievance is withdrawn, the fee will be returned. All decisions of the Committee will be final.

D. A general inquiry for an interpretation of a rule may be submitted in writing to the Competition Committee. The Committee will review the submission at their earliest convenience, and a written response will be provided. No fee is required for this review.

E. The tournament director may make decisions on any rules

clarification or equipment classification. If a shooter disagrees with the decision, they may file a formal grievance for review by the competition committee.

ER IX Unsportsmanlike conduct

- A. Unsportsmanlike conduct on the ranges or tournament grounds will not be tolerated.
- B. Any incident of unsportsmanlike conduct will be reported to a tournament official who will file a report with the Competition Committee immediately following the completion of the day's competition. The first offense upheld by the Committee will result in disqualification of the shooter from the event. A second offense will result in a suspension for the remainder of the season with no refund of any entry fees already paid.
- C. Verbal abuse directed at tournament officials, other shooters, or spectators will result in immediate disqualification of the shooter from the tournament, along with a referral to the Competition Committee for further disciplinary action.
- D. The use of profanity is prohibited and violators are subject to disqualification.
- E. Continued dispute of a Competition Committee ruling, either in person or via electronic means (ie. Internet forums) will result in disqualification and a 1 year or longer ban from Oklahoma City Gun Club events.

APPENDICES

APPENDIX 1 Membership Info

- A. Membership dues the first year are \$230 - \$180 annual dues and \$50 initiation fee.
- B. The first two years you are a member, you are an Associate Working Member. This means that the first two years of membership you are required to spend one day per year providing some type of work for the club. This can be anything from helping with a match on one of the ranges to cutting brush and mowing. The club has several scheduled work days during the year and the various Divisions schedule workdays for just their range. You are responsible for making arrangements and completing your workday obligation.

- C. After you have been a member for two years, you will have an option for different types of membership:
1. 1. Associate: What you have been for the past two years. Dues are \$180.00 without a workday, or \$100 with one.
 2. 2. Senior: Senior membership doesn't have anything to do with your age. A Senior Member may hold office and may vote in elections. To become a Senior Member, you must be recommended by another Senior Member and pay a one-time fee of \$100.00. You will be given a stock certificate that can be turned in should you leave the club and the \$100.00 will be returned. Dues are \$170.00 without a work day, or \$90 with one.
- D. We do not have a Family Membership, but if your spouse, son or daughter accompany you while you are on the range, that is fine. They must shoot from your firing point and they may not come to the club without you.
- E. The club publishes an electronic newsletter monthly that contains information on upcoming events, match results and general club information. In cases where members are unable to get it online -- for example, no internet access -- it is mailed to them. This newsletter also contains the names and phone numbers for all of the Division Chairpersons and Board Members so that you may contact them for information or to schedule your workday. There are a lot of different disciplines represented at our club and we invite you to come out to a match for a discipline your not familiar with to see what the other folks do. We think you'll enjoy yourself.
- F. The Club maintains a calendar of events on this website. It represents the most current information we have available. The newsletter calendar is a copy of that calendar as of a week or so before the newsletter goes to press. For the most current information available, check the online calendar.
